Miatas love to take on the roads. Once again, the Southern California Miata Club took off from Oakhurst for a day of curve hugging action. If you have never been on a run led by Don and Lisa Asperger, you have missed out on some of the best runs that SoCalm has to offer.


Although roads tend to be the highlight of runs, the Social aspect should not be overlooked. Again, there are not many restaurants in Oakhurst that can handle a group the size of the one on this run, so we enjoyed a festive Friday evening of Mexican fare at El Cid. El Cid is your typical Mexican restaurant in that you can get any combination of tacos, enchiladas, chile rellenos, tostadas, and just about any other Mexican food that you can imagine. As there are 92 numbered items on the menu, they have just about any combination that you could come up with, and at least one that you would not have imagined. Yes, Gary, they have hamburgers AND cheeseburgers served with fries!



Like Mexican food, driving speeds are a personal taste. In my opinion, Don drives fast enough for me to take on the roads as intended, but never too fast for the conditions, and definitely not so fast as to feel unsafe in any way. Pulling out of the Yosemite Southgate Lodge a wave of anticipation overwhelmed me and like a kid in a candy store, I was anticipating a varied and exciting run. I love runs with SoCalm and I especially enjoy Don and Lisa's routings. Early run highlights included old favorites like Triangle Road and 140 before we even entered Yosemite National Park.

Once we were in the park, the pace slowed a bit so that the natural scenery and the lovely natural sights and sounds could be experienced and could completely envelop your senses. Driving through Tioga Pass at 9945 feet above sea level at the Eastern edge of the park marked our exit from the park. Views of the tufas pointing up through increased water levels due to the winter precipitation in the Eastern Sierra in Mono Lake punctuated the landscape.

The views were so breathtaking and captivating that three cars missed the turn into the lunch stop, the Whoa Nelly Deli. Bruce Hamer served as the sweep for the group and this meant that he was tasked with chasing down the errant drivers. Being the sweep can at times be best described as akin to herding cats. Eventually everyone made it to lunch. Great job Bruce! Thank you for sweeping so that I did not have to.

Describing the lunch stop as food served in a gas station does not do justice to the quality and variety of dishes available at the Whoa Nelly. I enjoyed Wild Buffalo Meatloaf served with a port wine au jus and garlic mashed potatoes. This was not even the most sophisticated item on the menu. Yes, Gary, you will be happy to note that they serve several varieties of burgers also.

After lunch, we headed up highway 395 for about an hour until turning West on highway 89 for some uphill twisties and Monitor Pass at 8314 feet above sea level. Our next turn was on to highway 4 toward Ebbetts Pass at 8732 feet above sea level. Parts of highway 4 have no center line, which makes for some very fun driving before reaching our hotel!



Our hotel stopping point, the Bear Valley Lodge, was a very interesting property. It could be described as both funky and quaint. Which of these characteristics is more prevalent is not really up for debate. Both aspects can to be enjoyed in their yin and yang, as they are complimentary to each other. The property is used as a ski lodge during the snowy season, and thus has a very large parking lot. The lodge has a large common room with an incredible fireplace. More than one picture were taken by SoCalmers of this festive and rustic lounge area. After 244 miles of driving, wine and other libations were enjoyed in this venue before we were off for dinner.





Continuing East along on highway 108, our final decent took us to highway 395 and a turn South toward to the Whoa Nelly Deli again for lunch. That is where we said our farewells to the run leaders and those who wished to travel South along the Western side of the Sierras.



While writing about driving across four different passes, crossing the Sierras three times, and traveling for two days is done to provide a description of one fantastic Miata run, and as much as I enjoy reminiscing about all of the fun that was had on this run, it in no way compares to the pure joy and elation felt while driving these fabulous roads, seeing the wonderful scenery, and enjoying the company of great friends. The Miata is by far the best venue for enjoying these roads and SoCalm is the best club for people who enjoy driving.

El Segundo 54th Annual Holiday Parade - 12/10/2017

Description: Everyone loves a parade. Christmas comes once a year, and if you are in the holiday spirit after the Holiday Party, you can BE A PART OF the parade. **The El Segundo 54th Annual Holiday Parade takes place on Sunday, December 10th. This year's theme is TBD, but this IS the 100th anniversary of the founding of El Segundo, so I would expect that is going to be somehow part of the theme.** Line-up is from 12:00 Noon - 12:15 PM. The parade begins at 1:00 P.M.

El Segundo is a small town located in the South Bay. We hold a small town parade here. The Boy Scouts (cordless drill team), Girl Scouts, Pop Warner Football and Cheerleaders, baton twirlers, Little League, horse teams, Shriners, preschools, barber shop quartets, junior high and high school bands, along with various businesses have participated in the past and are all expected back this year. The Chamber of Commerce claims that 5000 people attend this parade each year.

Even though this is a driving club, this will be the shortest and SLOWEST run that you will ever participate in. Following the parade, we will meet at a restaurant to recap the harrowing experiences that we had at top speeds of seven miles per hour driving down the middle of the yellow line. Our line up position is TBD.

Here are the run directions:

- 1) Zero out your odometers and line up on Imperial Avenue
- 2) 0.1 turn LEFT on Main
- 3) 1.1 Parade ends at Main and El Segundo
- 4) Drive to California Pizza Kitchen in Manhattan Beach

FAIR WARNING NOTE: There is NO ACCESS TO BATHROOMS near the start of the parade route.

Here are the rules for entries into the parade:

- 1) You are encouraged to decorate your entry (car) based upon the theme of the parade and/or holiday season.
- 2) All designs and entries should be suitable for family viewing.
- 3) Please do NOT use a representative in a Santa costume. Santa ALWAYS rides on the Chevron Fire Truck at the end of the parade. We would not want children to be confused by seeing more than one Santa.
- 4) Commercial advertising is prohibited, but two banners or signs (maximum size 6' X 2') may be placed on two sides of the entry to acknowledge sponsoring companies/organizations.
- 5) Candy or other items may NOT be thrown from a car/van/float, etc. If items are to be distributed, then you may have members of your group (read that as "passenger") walk along side the crowd at the curb and hand them out. (This rule is pretty much ignored, though).

PARADE PREP: The now defunct Imperial Avenue School parking lot where we met in the past to decorate our cars is UNAVAILABLE. This area is now fenced off for construction. We will prep for the parade at the line-up location.




